HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 35

BY REPRESENTATIVE VILLIO

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To urge and request the Louisiana State Law Institute to conduct a review of particular misdemeanors, also known as "Duncan misdemeanors", that are located throughout the Louisiana Revised Statutes.

WHEREAS, R.S. 14:2(A)(6) defines a misdemeanor as any crime other than a felony; and

WHEREAS, the maximum penalty for a misdemeanor is six months imprisonment, a fine of one thousand dollars, or both; and

WHEREAS, Code of Criminal Procedure Article 779(B) provides that a defendant who is charged with a misdemeanor shall be tried by the court without a jury; and

WHEREAS, in 1968, the United States Supreme Court ruled in *Duncan v. Louisiana* that a trial by jury in criminal cases is required when the penalty authorized for the particular crime is severe enough to classify it as a serious offense; and

WHEREAS, after the ruling in *Duncan*, the Legislature of Louisiana amended Code of Criminal Procedure Article 779 to provide the right to a jury trial for a defendant charged with a misdemeanor when the punishment, as set forth in the statute defining the offense, may be a fine in excess of one thousand dollars or imprisonment for more than six months; and

WHEREAS, these particular misdemeanors are also known as "Duncan misdemeanors"; and

WHEREAS, over one hundred twenty Duncan misdemeanors are contained throughout the entirety of the Louisiana Revised Statutes; and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding Code of Criminal Procedure Article 779, the jury system in Louisiana is not structured in a manner to implement jury trials for misdemeanor offenses; and

WHEREAS, misdemeanors with consistent penalty ranges ensure that defendants do not face severe penalties for petty offenses and that district attorneys are able to prosecute misdemeanors within the safeguards of due process.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the Louisiana State Law Institute to conduct a review of particular misdemeanors, also known as "Duncan misdemeanors", that are located throughout the Louisiana Revised Statutes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the director of the Louisiana State Law Institute.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Louisiana State Law Institute shall submit one print copy and one electronic copy of any report produced pursuant to this Resolution to the David R. Poynter Legislative Research Library as required by R.S. 24:772.

**REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE IN RESPONSE TO  
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 35 OF THE 2025 REGULAR SESSION**

House Concurrent Resolution No. 35 of the 2025 Regular Session urged and requested the Louisiana State Law Institute to conduct a review of certain misdemeanors, also known as "*Duncan* misdemeanors," that are located throughout the Louisiana Revised Statutes. In fulfillment of this request, the Law Institute assigned this project to its Criminal Code and Code of Criminal Procedure Committee, which operates under the direction of retired Judge Marilyn Castle as Reporter.

Louisiana law recognizes that trial of any offense in which the penalty provides for the possibility of a hard labor sentence requires a jury. All other offenses are classified as misdemeanors. In 1968, the United States Supreme Court ruled in *Duncan v. Louisiana*, 391 U.S. 145, that a trial by jury in criminal cases is required, even if the penalty does not provide for the possibility of a hard labor sentence, if the penalty for the particular crime is severe enough to classify it as a serious offense. In keeping with the *Duncan* ruling, Code of Criminal Procedure Article 779 provides:

A. A defendant charged with a misdemeanor in which the punishment, as set forth in the statute defining the offense, may be a fine in excess of one thousand dollars or imprisonment for more than six months shall be tried by a jury of six jurors, all of whom must concur to render a verdict.

\* \* \*

Therefore, *Duncan* misdemeanors are offenses for which the penalty does not include the possibility of a hard labor sentence, but which carry penalties of imprisonment for more than six months and/or fines in excess of one thousand dollars.

Law Institute and legislative staff worked together to compile a list of *Duncan* misdemeanors that appear throughout the law and a chart of the relevant language that causes

each statute to qualify under the definition thereof. There are over three hundred offenses that fall within this category, and the chart has been appended to this report.

The issues created by *Duncan* misdemeanors include burdens on the court system of additional jury trials, reluctance to prosecute due to limited jury time, and lack of jurisdiction by some city and local courts that cannot conduct jury trials.

In examining the chart of *Duncan* offenses, particular observations were made. In certain instances, a slight increase in the amount of a fine may have unintentionally placed an offense in this category. In other cases, however, the severe penalty provided indicates the Legislature's intention to trigger the requirement of a jury trial.

The Law Institute acknowledges the need to alleviate the inadvertent creation of additional *Duncan* misdemeanors and the unintended ramifications thereof. Several suggestions were presented for addressing these offenses in a broad manner. Those suggestions include:

- (1) Amending Code of Criminal Procedure Article 779 within federal and state constitutional restraints to moderately increase the triggering fine amount.
- (2) Lowering the available penalties for specific offenses listed in the attached chart to provide for penalties not exceeding one thousand dollars or six months in prison, if doing so reflects the Legislature's intent regarding the seriousness of those offenses.
- (3) Providing prosecutors with discretion to declare, in charging these offenses, that no penalty in excess of the ceiling limit may be imposed.

The Law Institute submits these options for consideration by the Legislature but does not make any recommendations concerning the adoption thereof.

## **Duncan Misdemeanors**

### **General Rules**

#### **Code of Criminal Procedure Article 779:**

*A. A defendant charged with a **misdemeanor** in which the punishment, as set forth in the statute defining the offense, may be a **fine in excess of one thousand dollars or imprisonment for more than six months shall be tried by a jury of six jurors**, all of whom must concur to render a verdict.*

*B. The defendant charged with any other misdemeanor shall be tried by the court without a jury.*

#### **Children's Code Article 1530:**

*A. A defendant charged with a **misdemeanor** in which the punishment, as set forth in the statute defining the offense, may be a **fine in excess of one thousand dollars or imprisonment for more than six months, shall be tried by a jury of six jurors**, all of whom must concur to render a verdict.*

*B. The defendant charged with any other misdemeanor shall be tried by the court without a jury.*

#### **R.S. 15:303:**

Whenever the punishment of fine and imprisonment are left by law to the discretion of any court, the fine shall not exceed one thousand dollars, nor the imprisonment two years.

**Reasoning:** Because of due process considerations, a jury trial is required for any penalty over six months or over \$1,000 fine (i.e. petty crimes). Our courts are not structured for a jury trial on a misdemeanor. There are over 300 *Duncan* misdemeanors in current law.
